
The Southeastern Wood Producers Association Founded by Loggers for Loggers





About the Southeastern Wood Producers Association Inc.

The Association was formed by timber harvesting business owners in 1990 from Florida and Georgia. We are an association "formed by loggers for loggers". We have grown from a handful of business owners to an organization representing approximately 400 timber harvesting business owners and 150 associate member businesses since that time including members and sponsors from neighboring states as well as national corporations.

The SPWA organization is structured to provide for comprehensive staff support in both states and to allow for associate member/sponsors to take a greater role in leadership and support. Four at-large seats of the Board of Directors are held by associate member company representatives.

Our 23rd Annual Meeting will be held June 7-8, 2013 at Lake Blackshear Resort in Cordele, Georgia. Each year the Annual Meeting offers great opportunity for our sponsor/partners to network with member business owners.
